**Size:** One half document box.

**Organizational History of Clifton Academy:** Four of the seven Safford Children have letters included in this collection. They were raised in Greensboro, GA and their father was Rev. Henry Safford.

**Description:** The Safford Letter Collection is 17 letters dating from 1846 to 1864 between siblings Mary Safford (Mrs. W.H. Thompson), Eunice B. Safford (Mrs. S.E. Scudder), Henry Safford, William 'Willie' B. Safford, and others. The Saffords were four of seven children of Rev. Henry Safford and were raised in Greensboro, Georgia. Eunice Safford and her husband Samuel Erwin Scudder lived in Decatur during the time period of this collection.

Article written by Mary J. Thompson (Mary Safford) describing a visit to the "old home place" near Penfield, Georgia; dated 1865
